Hierarchy of Services & Settlements:

Small settlements are limited to consumer services that have small thresholds, short ranges & small market areas.

Large settlements can provide consumer services with large thresholds, ranges & market areas

Rank-Size Distribution: a commonly observed statistical relationship between the population sizes and population ranks of a nation's cities

The 2nd largest city in a country is 1/2 the size of the largest city.

NOTE: Not all countries follow the "Rank Size Rule!
