



Intraregional migration in Boston 1970-199


What is forced migration?

Why do you think this is happening?




According to this map, what is the current global migration pattern trend?


From LDC s to MDC s

Since 1990 where have most immigrants come from?

There have been 3 main eras of immigration in U.S. History (Figure 3-8):

1st) Initial settlement of colonies (1700s-1840)

90% of the immigrants to the U.S. were British

2nd) 1840s-1914

Germany (7.2 million), Ireland (5.3), Italy (4.8), Russia (4.1), etc.

3rd) 1970-Present
